## RESOLUTION NO. 2016\_\_\_\_\_

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA RECITING THE FACT OF THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THIS CITY ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016, DECLARING THE RESULTS THEREOF, AND OTHER MATTERS AS ARE PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held and conducted in the City of Chula Vista, on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, for the purpose of electing two (2) members of the City Council, representing Districts 3 and 4, each for a full term of four years, commencing in December 2016, and for submitting one ballot measure (Measure P) to the electorate; and

WHEREAS, the measure, as stated in the ordinance placing it on the ballot, was:

MEASURE P.  To repair neighborhood streets and sidewalks, replace storm drains to prevent sinkholes, update police, paramedic and 9-1-1 equipment and facilities, improve parks, repair recreation facilities, and for general city services and	YES
infrastructure, shall the City of Chula Vista adopt an ordinance enacting a temporary ½ cent sales tax, generating an estimated \$16 million per year, expiring in 10 years, with no further increases without voter approval, with all funds staying in Chula Vista, requiring citizen oversight and independent audits?	NO

WHEREAS, notice of said election was duly and regularly given in the time, form, and manner as provided by law; and in all respects the election was held and conducted, and the votes cast at the election received and canvassed, and the returns made and declared, in the time, form, and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in charter cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution Nos. 2016-134 and 2016-146, adopted July 12, 2016, the election was consolidated with the statewide general election, and the Registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of said election and has certified the results. The results have been received and are attached as Exhibit A to this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DECLARED, AND DETERMINED by the City Council of the City of Chula Vista, that:

1. The City of Chula Vista had 127,880 registered voters eligible to vote in the November 8, 2016 election. There were 149 voting precincts established in Chula Vista for the purpose of holding the election.

2. The total number of votes received by each candidate is as follows:

## A. FOR MEMBER OF THE CITY COUNCIL, DISTRICT 3 (four-year term)

STEVE PADILLA 12,720 VOTES (55.86%)

JASON PAGUIO 10,016 VOTES (43.98%)

The City Council does hereby declare and determine that Steve Padilla, having received a majority of all votes cast, is elected to the office of District 3 City Council Member, to be sworn into office on December 13, 2016.

B. FOR MEMBER OF THE CITY COUNCIL, DISTRICT 4 (four-year term)

MIKE DIAZ 10,205 VOTES (52.10%)

RUDY RAMIREZ 9,358 VOTES (47.77%)

The City Council does hereby declare and determine that Mike Diaz, having received a majority of all votes cast, is elected to the office of District 4 City Council Member, to be sworn into office on December 13, 2016.

3. The total number of votes received for the measure is as follows:

MEASURE P FOR AGAINST 64,704 VOTES (68.43%) 29,845 (31.57%)

The City Council does hereby declare that a majority of voters who voted on Measure P voted in favor of it, and that the measure was carried, and shall be deemed adopted and ratified.

- 4. The number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to the candidates named above for the offices for which they were candidates, and for and against Measure P, are listed in Exhibit A, attached to this Resolution and incorporated by this reference.
- 5. The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City of Chula Vista a statement of the results of the election, showing: (1) The whole number of votes cast in the City; (2) The names of the persons voted for; (3) The measure voted upon; (4) For what office each person was voted for; (5) The number of votes given at each precinct to each person, and for and against the measure; (6) The total number of votes given to each person, and for and against the measure.
- 6. That the City Clerk shall immediately sign and deliver to each of the persons so elected a certificate of election; that the City Clerk shall also administer to each person elected the Oath of Office prescribed in California Constitution and shall have them subscribe to it and file it in the office of the City Clerk. The term for each person so elected shall then commence.
