TITLE

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF POLICE INTERCEPTOR VEHICLES FROM WONDRIES FLEET GROUP

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Council adopt the resolution.

SUMMARY

In December 2018, the City of Chula Vista issued a Request for Bid (RFB) for 12 units of 2020 Interceptor Utility Pursuit Vehicles for the Police Department. As a result of the bid process, the City selected Wondries Fleet Group to purchase the vehicles. The Police Department is seeking approval to purchase twenty-two (22) more units of 2020 Interceptor Utility Pursuit Vehicles at the bid price.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The Director of Development Services has reviewed the proposed activity for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and has determined that the activity is not a "Project" as defined under Section 15378 of the State CEQA Guidelines because it will not result in a physical change in the environment; therefore, pursuant to Section 15060(c)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines, the activity is not subject to CEQA. Thus, no environmental review is required.

DISCUSSION

On December 20, 2018, the City issued a Request for Bid (# B17-18/19) for 12 units of 2020 Interceptor Utility Pursuit Vehicles (Hybrid option) for the Police Department. As a result of the bid process, the City selected Wondries Fleet Group to purchase the 12 vehicles.

Since 2010, the Police Department has been purchasing vehicles from Wondries Fleet Group. This vendor was selected during the bid process because they offered the lowest bid at \$42,684 cost per vehicle.

Upon review of the existing police fleet, it is anticipated that twenty-two (22) vehicles are needed next fiscal year. Because there is a production delay of 2020 Ford models, the Finance Department issued a Letter of

Intent to purchase 22 vehicles, which is expected to deliver in September or October. The total cost for twenty-two (22) Ford Utility Hybrid Police Interceptors is \$939,057.

DECISION-MAKER CONFLICT

Staff has reviewed the decision contemplated by this action and has determined that it is not site-specific and consequently, the 500-foot rule found in California Code of Regulations Title 2, section 18702.2(a)(11), is not applicable to this decision for purposes of determining a disqualifying real property-related financial conflict of interest under the Political Reform Act (Cal. Gov't Code § 87100, et seq.).

Staff is not independently aware, and has not been informed by any City Council member, of any other fact that may constitute a basis for a decision maker conflict of interest in this matter.

CURRENT-YEAR FISCAL IMPACT

The \$939,057 cost of the 22 Ford Utility Hybrid Police Interceptor Vehicles is already included in the City's Infrastructure, Facilities and Equipment expenditure plan (Measure P funding). Approval of this resolution has no net fiscal impact to the General Fund.

ONGOING FISCAL IMPACT

There is no ongoing fiscal impact for approving the purchase.
