### TERM LIMITS LEGAL FRAMEWORK

#### City Council Agenda Item No. 7 January 12, 2016

#### 1. City Charter

- a. Four-Year Terms
- b. One-Year "Waiting" Period after Two Terms
- c. No Lifetime Limit on Total Number of Terms or Years
- d. Applies to Mayor, City Council members and City Attorney

#### 2. State and Federal Law

- Term Limits have been Upheld Against Constitutional Challenges (1<sup>st</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Amendments)
- b. California Constitution Gives Charter City Authority over its Elections
- c. Term Limits have been found to be Municipal Affairs
- d. Government Code Section 36502
  - Specifically Authorizes Cities to Implement Term Limits
  - ii. Requires Adoption at Regularly Scheduled Election
  - iii. Allows Prospective Application Only
  - iv. Applicability to Charter Cities?
