TITLE

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA ACCEPTING MULTIPLE DONATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$14,000 FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH PARKS & RECREATION FACILITIES AND PROGRAMS AND AMENDING THE FY2019/2020 PARKS AND RECREATION BUDGET TO REFLECT THE APPROPRIATION OF THESE FUNDS (4/5 VOTE REQUIRED)

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Council adopt the resolution.

SUMMARY

Multiple donors have made donations to Parks and Recreation to fund costs associated with the parks & recreation facilities and programs. Today's action asks the City Council to accept the donations and appropriate these funds.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The proposed activity has been reviewed for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and it has been determined that the activity is not a "Project" as defined under Section 15378 of the state CEQA Guidelines because it will not result in a physical change in the environment; therefore, pursuant to Section 15060(c)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines, the activity is not subject to CEQA. Notwithstanding the foregoing, it has also been determined that the activity qualifies for an Exemption pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the California Environmental Quality Act State Guidelines. Thus, no environmental review is required.

BOARD/COMMISSION/COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Not Applicable.

DISCUSSION

Republic Services donated \$10,000 to help provide necessary amenities at dog parks, such as dog waste dispensaries and bags, throughout the City. The Friends of Chula Vista Parks and Recreation donated funds in the amount of \$4,000 for the Youth Scholarship Program which helps offset program fees for low-income Chula Vista residents.

DECISION-MAKER CONFLICT

Staff has reviewed the property holdings of the City Council members and has found that Councilmember McCann has real property holdings within 1,000 feet of the boundaries of the property which is the subject of this action. However, to the extent that any decision would have a reasonably foreseeable financial effect on the member's real property, the effect would be nominal, inconsequential, or insignificant. Consequently, pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 2, sections 18700 and 18702(b), this item does not present a real property-related conflict of interest under the Political Reform Act (Cal. Gov't Code § 87100, et seq.).

Staff is not independently aware, and has not been informed by any City Council member, of any other fact that may constitute a basis for a decision-maker conflict of interest in this matter.

CURRENT-YEAR FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of this resolution will result in an appropriation of \$14,000 from multiple donors to Parks and Recreation's budget. Funds from Republic Services were issued for one time use to help pay for amenities at dog parks throughout the City. The Youth Scholarship Program is funded on a quarterly basis. Funds are used to supplement costs of programs and activities for low-income families. There is no net fiscal impact to the General Fund.

ONGOING FISCAL IMPACT

There is no on-going impact to the budget.
