

COVID-19 Percentage Positive




Percentage of Positive COVID-19 Cases Among Tests by Date Reported Total Number of Cases = 65,601

Trend of Cases Countywide




COVID-19 Cases in San Diego County by Illness Onset Date





RISE OF COVID-19 CASES IN THE PAST MONTH





Daily New Cases in Chula Vista




COVID-19 Hospital Daily Census in San Diego County Includes Cases and Suspect COVID-19 Patients

COVID-19 Daily Hospital Bed Census





COVID-19 Daily ICU Bed Occupancy and Capacity, San Diego County Includes Cases and Suspect COVID-19 Patients



California is Pulling an Emergency Brake

- Counties will move back after 1 week, not just 2 weeks.
- Because of significant increases, some counties will move multiple tiers.
- Counties that move back must make industry changes urgently, instead of 3 days, with phased in enforcement.
- California will assess tiers again mid-week.




Chula Vista Case Rate

Case Rate by ZIP Code/ Jurisdiction - San Diego County currently in PURPLE tier






ase Rate by ZIP Code/ Jurisdiction - San Diego County currently in PURPLE tier






ase Rate by ZIP Code/ Jurisdiction - San Diego County currently in PURPLE tier






E INATE DY ZIF COME/ JULISMICTION - San Diego County currently in PURPLE tier






se Rate by ZIP Code/ Jurisdiction - San Diego County currently in PURPLE tier

Compliance Team

- Chula Vista among top jurisdictions in compliance investigations
- COVID cases are a top priority for DSD
 - The number of joint investigations conducted by City and County staff exceeds that of other jurisdictions



Compliance Team

- DSD, City Attorney's Office, CVPD, County of San Diego
 - Code Enforcement Officers have conducted more than 80 investigations
 - 43 Voluntary Compliance
 - 17 No Violation
 - 33 Warning Letters
 - 3 Notice of Violation
 - 3 Cease and Desist Letters
 - 0 Individual Closure Notice

CDPH Travel Guidance

Travel Advisory for Non-Essential Travel

- Californians are encouraged to stay home or in their region and avoid non-essential travel.
 - Avoiding travel can reduce the risk of virus transmission and bringing the virus back to California.
- Persons arriving in California from other states or countries, including returning California residents, should practice self-quarantine for 14 days after arrival.
 - Limit interactions to immediate household.
 - Recommendation does not apply for essential travel.



Thanksgiving Guidance



Host/attend remote events with family and friends—virtual Thanksgiving dinner, sharing recipes, playing online games.



Avoid carnivals, festivals, live-entertainment, and in-person turkey trots as close interactions increase risks of infection.



Consider safer alternatives that include shopping online versus inperson for Black Friday, donating food to charities at drive-through mobile pantries, or visiting a local park/preserve to celebrate Green Friday.



Ensure Personal Protection Measures are continually followed —get a flu shot.
