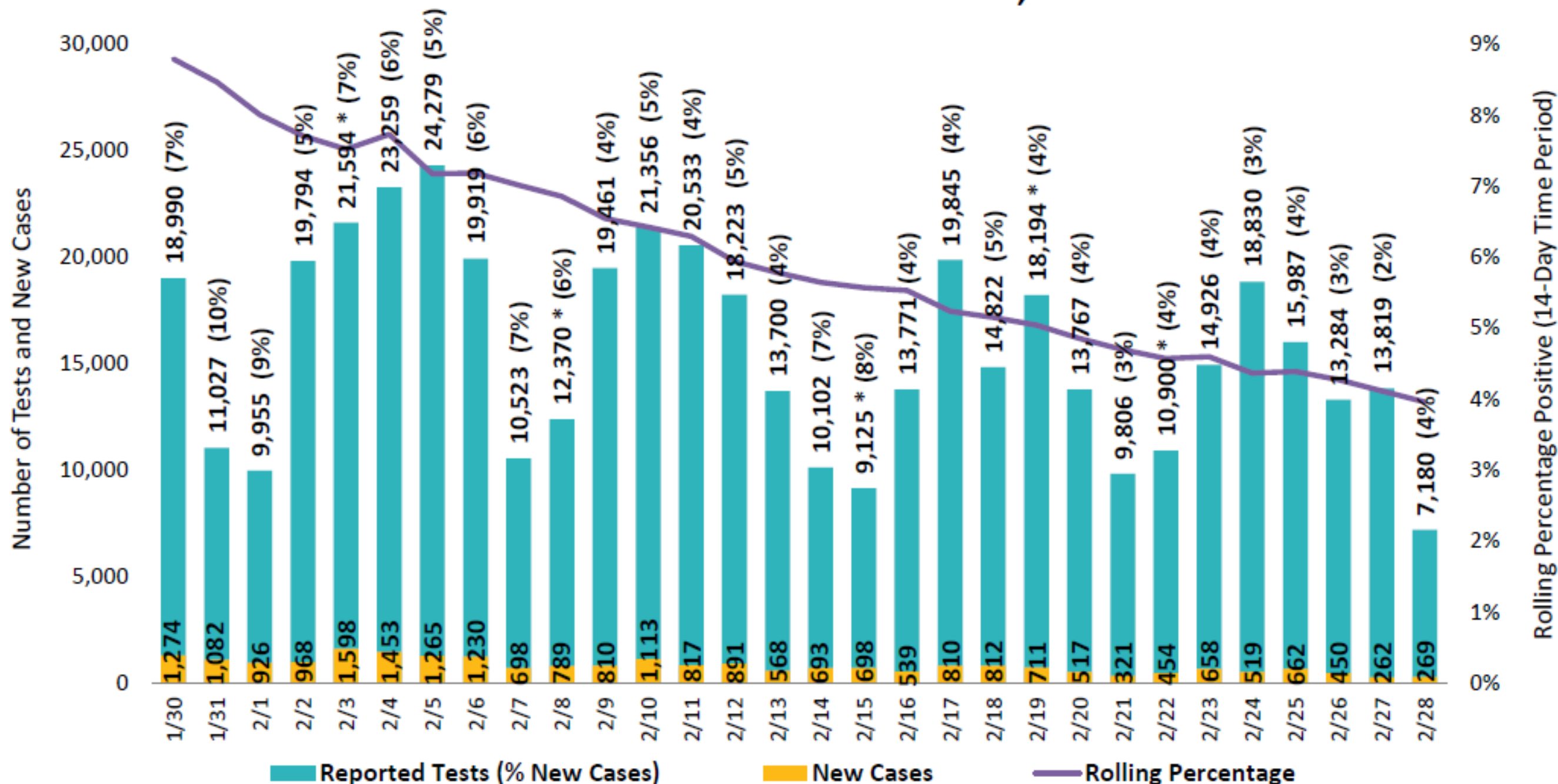

Percentage of Positive COVID-19 Cases Among Tests by Date Reported Total Number of Cases = 260,625

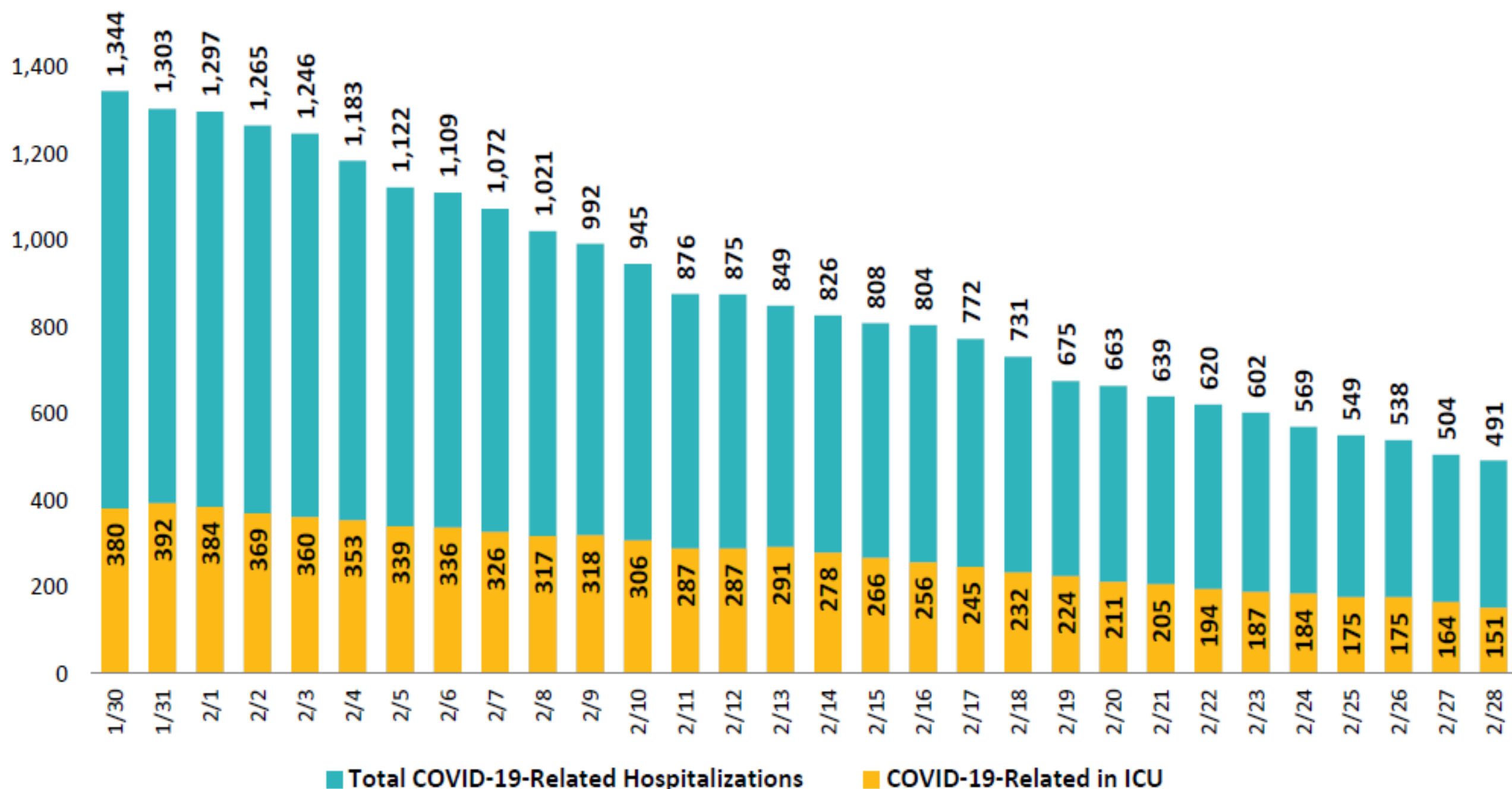

COVID-19 Hospital Daily Census in San Diego County Includes Cases and Suspect COVID-19 Patients

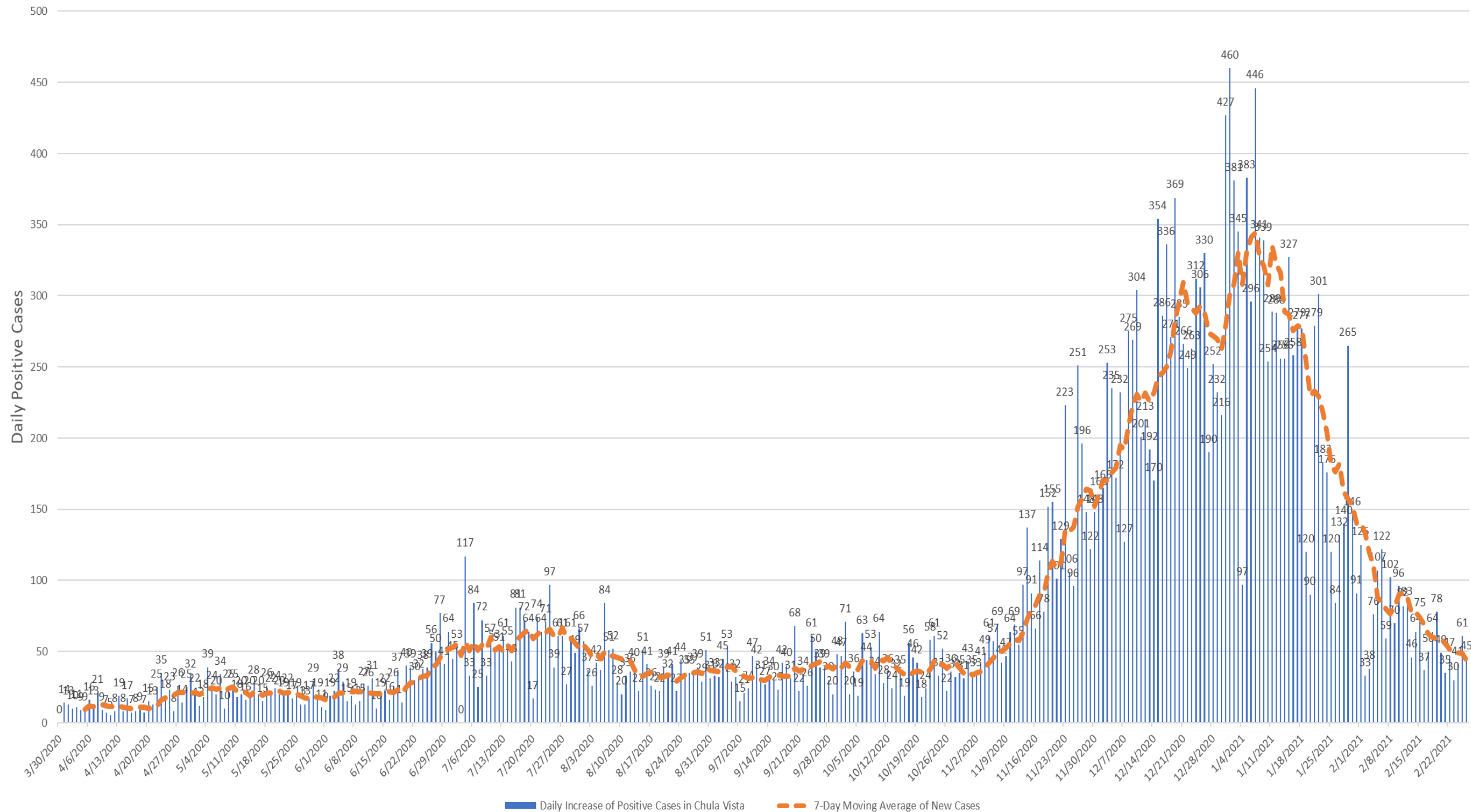

Phase 1B — *began January 2021**

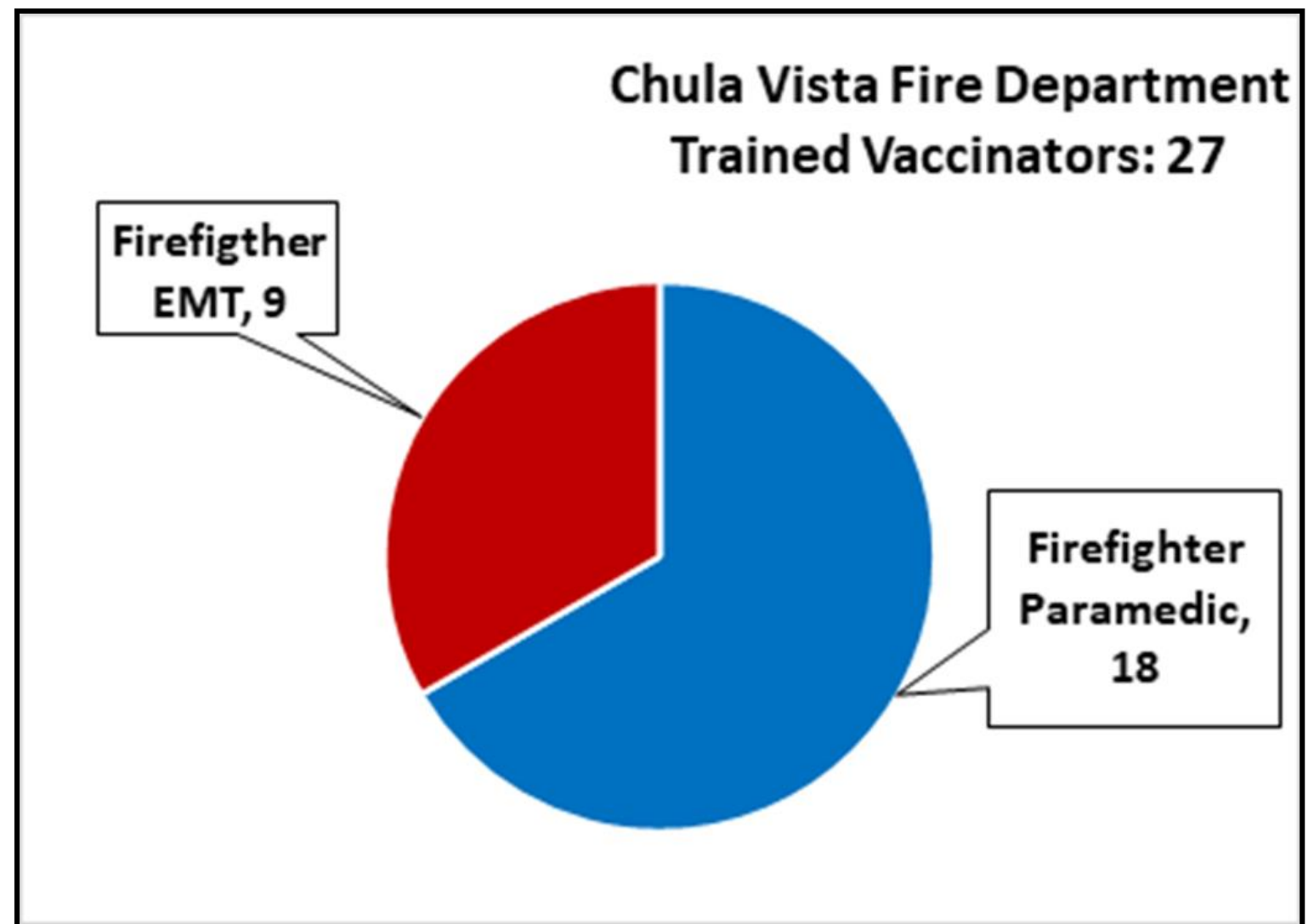
- ☑ Individuals 75 years and older — *vaccinating since 01/18/2021*
- ☑ Individuals 65-74 years — *vaccinating since 01/23/2021*
- ☑ Frontline essential workers at risk of exposure through their work in the following sectors:
Emergency Services (including emergency operations workers, fire, and law enforcement);
Childcare & Education; and Food & Agriculture — *vaccinating since 02/27/2021*

Phase 1C — *beginning March 15, 2021**

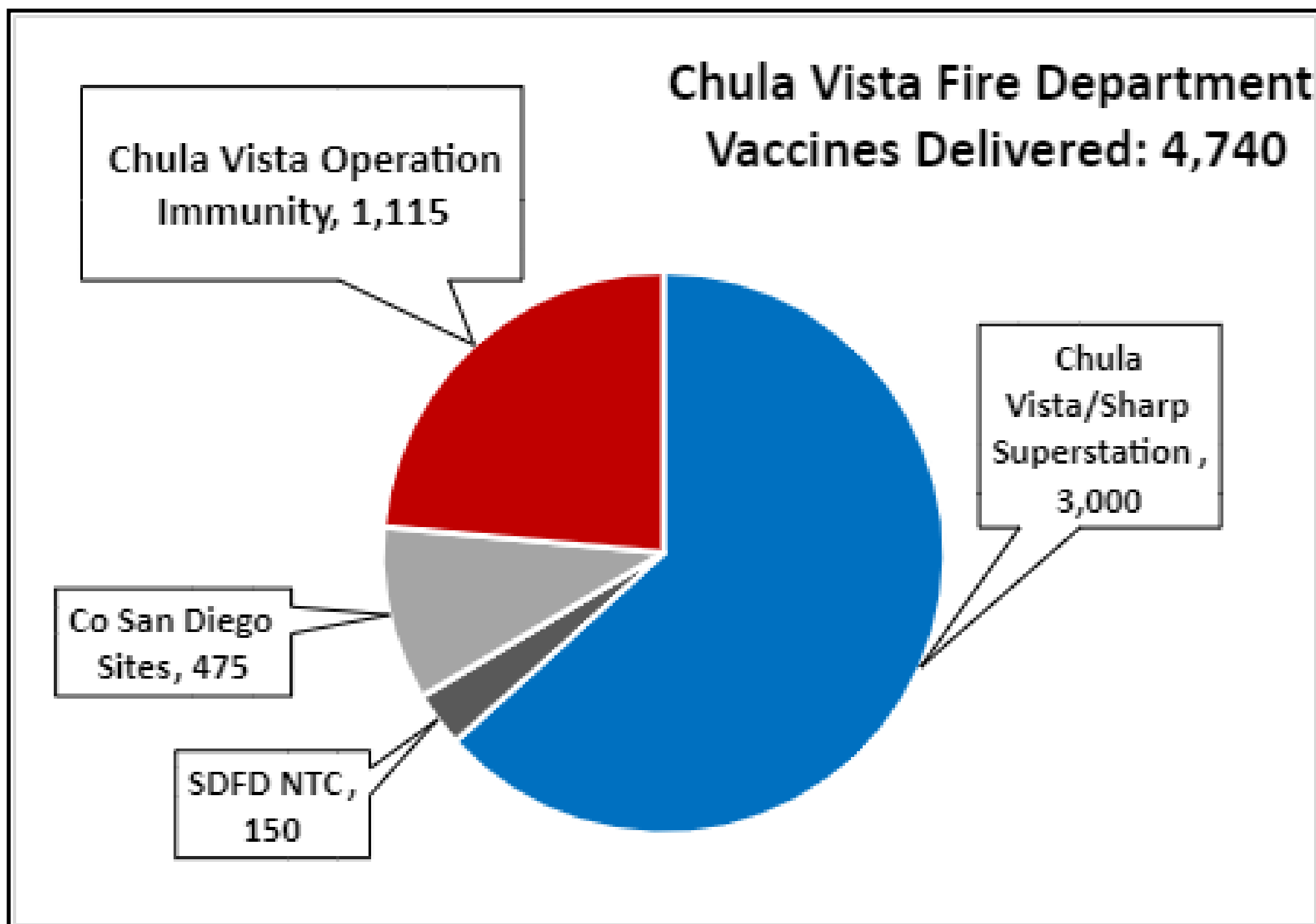
- ☐ **Persons 16-64 years with one or more of the following health conditions:**
 - Cancer, current with debilitated or immunocompromised state
 - Chronic kidney disease, stage 4 or above
 - Chronic pulmonary disease, oxygen dependent
 - Down syndrome
 - Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) from solid organ transplant
 - Pregnancy
 - Sickle cell disease
 - Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies (excludes hypertension)
 - Severe obesity (Body Mass Index ≥ 40 kg/m²)
 - Type 2 diabetes mellitus with hemoglobin A1c level greater than 7.5%
- OR**
- If as a result of a developmental or other severe high-risk disability one or more of the following applies:
 - The individual is likely to develop severe life-threatening illness or death from COVID-19 infection
 - Acquiring COVID-19 will limit the individual's ability to receive ongoing care or services vital to their well-being and survival
 - Providing adequate and timely COVID-19 care will be particularly challenging as a result of the individual's disability
