#### RETROSPECTIVE

- Previous Cannabis Workshops in August & October 2017
- December 2017 Preliminary Draft Ordinance
  - Public Comment & Council Requests
    - Reach out to Cannabis Industry
    - Restrict to Most Qualified Applicants/Eliminate Unlawful Actors
    - Add Labor Peace Agreement requirement
    - Employee Training Requirement
    - Ensure Location Restrictions Allow Intended Number of Businesses
    - Include Product & Advertising Restrictions
    - Add City/State Contact for Complaints
    - Prioritize Community Investment and Public Education
    - Strong Enforcement
    - Consider Federal Law Issues

#### PROPOSED ORDINANCE

- Collective Work to Date
  - Weekly Meetings, Multi-Departmental Participation
- Authorized License Types
  - Storefront Retailer (no Delivery)
  - Non-Storefront Retailer
  - Cultivator (Indoor only)
  - Manufacturer
  - Distributor
  - Testing Laboratory

#### **NUMBER & LOCATION**

- Number of Licenses
  - Storefront & Non-Storefront Retailers
    - Maximum of 3 per Council District, with no more than 2 Storefront Retailers per District
  - Cultivators, Distributors, Manufacturers, and Testing Laboratories
    - No Limit on Number of Licenses
- Location Requirements
  - Storefront Retailers
    - permitted in Commercial Zones or, with a CUP, in Industrial Zones
  - Non-Storefront Retailers, Cultivators, Distributors, Manufacturing, and Testing Laboratories
    - permitted in Industrial Zones


### SEPARATION REQUIREMENTS

- Storefront Retailers
  - 1,000' from Day Care Center or Public/Private K-12 School
  - 600' from Treatment Facility, Youth Center, Youth-Oriented Business, or Public/Private Park
  - 150' from existing residential use or proposed exclusive residential zone
- Cultivators, Distributors, Manufacturers, and Testing Laboratories
  - 150' from any zone allowing residential uses


### MEASURING SEPARATION REQUIREMENTS

- Measuring Points differ depending on use
  - Commercial Cannabis Business
  - Day Care Center, Youth Center, Youth-Oriented Business, Treatment Facility
  - Public or Private School, Public or Private Park, residential use or residential zone
- Measurement Path
  - Depends on measuring points
  - Examples included


# MEASUREMENT PATH DOOR TO DOOR



#### MEASUREMENT PATH




# MEAUREMENT PATH DOOR TO DOOR ON SAME PREMISES

#### APPLICATION PROCESS

- Three Phases
- Phase One
  - Identify Experience
    - No history of unlawful activity
    - Lawful cannabis or controlled substance business experience
  - Assess Business Plan and Finances
    - Must submit business and operating plans
    - Liquid asset requirement
    - Labor Peace Agreement requirement
  - Criminal Background Check

### APPLICATION PROCESS (CONT.)

- Phase Two
  - Choose Location and Obtain Site Permits
  - Security and Emergency Action/Fire Prevention Plans
  - Obtain Employee Work Permits
- Conditional License (Phase Three)
  - Finalize Permits
  - Obtain State License

# OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS & RESTRICTIONS

- Training Requirement
- Product & Sales restrictions
  - Limit on amount that can be sold per person per day
  - THC mg restrictions on edible products
  - No cannabis-infused beverages
- Advertising/marketing restrictions
  - Apply to all persons, not just Licensees
  - Products that aren't permitted can't be advertised
  - Can't be near sensitive uses
  - Can't be attractive to youth
  - Can't contain false statements/inferences

# COMMUNITY RELATIONS & INVESTMENT

- Community Relations Contact
  - Reach out to nearby businesses and residents
  - Provide contact information for reporting problems to business, city, and state
- Community Investment
  - Operator must cooperate
  - Annual budgeting for:
    - Enforcement
    - Education
    - Prevention

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

- Civil Enforcement
  - Civil Penalties of up to \$10,000 per day
  - Suspension/Revocation of License
  - Tiered Enforcement
  - Civil Litigation
- Criminal Enforcement
  - Criminal Prosecution Unit
  - Can be funded with tax revenue

### TIMELINE/NEXT STEPS

- 1. Place Ordinance on First Reading
- 2. Second Reading and Adoption
- Present Cannabis Tax Measure for City Council Approval
- 4. Ordinance Implementation
  - Draft and Approve Regulations, Fees, and Forms
  - Accept Applications
  - Issue Licenses January 2019 Target Date
