WHEREAS, on May 5, 2016, the Planning Commission held a duly noticed joint public meeting with the GMOC and the City Council to consider the GMOC's 2016 Annual Report, and to make recommendations to the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Planning Commission of the City of Chula Vista does hereby accept and forward the GMOC's 2016 Annual Report and recommendations contained therein to the City Council for consideration.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Commission recommends that the City Council accept the GMOC's 2016 Annual Report.
