TITLE

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA ACCEPTING \$18,500 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL AND APPROPRIATING SAID FUNDS TO THE POLICE GRANTS SECTION OF THE STATE GRANTS FUND (4/5 VOTE REQUIRED)

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Council adopt the resolution.

SUMMARY

The Police Department has recently received notice of grant award in the amount of \$18,500 from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC). The grant funds will be used during an 11-month period to conduct Minor Decoy, Shoulder Tap, and IMPACT operations and inspections.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The Director of Development Services has reviewed the proposed activity for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and has determined that the activity is not a "Project" as defined under Section 15378 of the State CEQA Guidelines because it will not result in a physical change in the environment; therefore, pursuant to Section 15060(c)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines, the activity is not subject to CEQA. Thus, no environmental review is required.

DISCUSSION

The Police Department has been awarded \$18,500 from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC). This 11-month project will include operations for the Minor Decoy, Shoulder Tap, and IMPACT programs. The goal of the Minor Decoy Program is to reduce the number of licensees who sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The Shoulder Tap Program targets adults who furnish alcoholic beverages to minors. IMPACT (Informed Merchants Preventing Alcohol-Related Crime Tendencies) inspections focus on licensee education.

DECISION-MAKER CONFLICT

Staff has reviewed the decision contemplated by this action and has determined that it is not site-specific and consequently, the 500-foot rule found in California Code of Regulations Title 2, section 18702.2(a)(11),

is not applicable to this decision for purposes of determining a disqualifying real property-related financial conflict of interest under the Political Reform Act (Cal. Gov't Code § 87100, et seq.).

Staff is not independently aware, and has not been informed by any City Council member, of any other fact that may constitute a basis for a decision maker conflict of interest in this matter.

LINK TO STRATEGIC GOALS

The City's Strategic Plan has five major goals: Operational Excellence, Economic Vitality, Healthy Community, Strong and Secure Neighborhoods and a Connected Community. The ABC grant funds supports the goal of Strong and Secure Neighborhoods by targeting and addressing problematic alcohol establishments.

CURRENT-YEAR FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of this resolution will result in a one-time appropriation of \$17,800 to the Personnel and \$700 Supplies and Services category of the Police Grants Section of the State Grants Fund. The funding from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control will completely offset these costs, resulting in no net fiscal impact to the General Fund.

ONGOING FISCAL IMPACT

There is no ongoing fiscal impact for accepting these grant funds.
