RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
CHULA VISTA RECITING THE FACT OF THE SPECIAL  
MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THIS CITY ON  
NOVEMBER 6, 2018, DECLARING THE RESULTS THEREOF,  
AND OTHER MATTERS AS ARE PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held and conducted in the City of Chula Vista, California, on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, as required by law, for the purpose of electing a Mayor, two (2) members of the City Council, representing Districts 1 and 2, and a City Attorney, each for a full term of four years, commencing in December 2018, and for submitting one ballot measure (Measure Q) to the electorate; and

WHEREAS, the measure, as stated in the ordinance placing it on the ballot, was:

<b>MEASURE Q.</b> Shall the measure to impose a business license tax of at least 5%, and up to 15%, of gross receipts on cannabis (marijuana) businesses, and at least \$5, and up to \$25, per square foot on space dedicated to cannabis cultivation, to raise an estimated \$6,000,000 per year, until voters change or repeal it, to fund general City services, including enforcement efforts against cannabis businesses that are operating illegally, be adopted? WHEREAS, notice of said election was duly and regularly given in the time, form, and manner as provided by law; and in all respects the election was held and conducted, and the votes cast at the election received and canvassed, and the returns made and declared, in the time, form, and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in charter cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2018-128, adopted July 10, 2018, and Resolution No. 2018-158, adopted July 24, 2018, and the election was consolidated with the statewide general election, and the Registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of said election and has certified the results. The results are received and made a part hereof, attached as Exhibit 1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DECLARED, AND DETERMINED by the City Council of the City of Chula Vista, that:

1. The City of Chula Vista had 140,099 registered voters eligible to vote in the November 6, 2018 election. There were 122 voting precincts established in Chula Vista for the purpose of holding the election.

2. The total number of votes received by each candidate is as follows:

a. FOR MAYOR (four-year term)

MARY CASILLAS SALAS                      54,062 VOTES (71.86%)

HECTOR RAUL GASTELUM                      21,175 VOTES (28.14%)

The City Council does hereby declare and determine that Mary Casillas Salas, having received a majority of all votes cast, is elected to the office of Mayor, to be sworn into office on December 11, 2018.

b. FOR MEMBER OF THE CITY COUNCIL, DISTRICT 1 (four-year term)

JOHN McCANN                                      11,945 VOTES (51.66%)

MARK BARTLETT                                      11,178 VOTES (48.34%)

The City Council does hereby declare and determine that John McCann, having received a majority of all votes cast, is elected to the office of District 1 City Council Member, to be sworn into office on December 11, 2018.

c. FOR MEMBER OF THE CITY COUNCIL, DISTRICT 2 (four-year term)

JILL M. GALVEZ                                      8,871 VOTES (52.50%)

STEVE STENBERG                                      8,027 VOTES (47.50%)

The City Council does hereby declare and determine that Jill M. Galvez, having received a majority of all votes cast, is elected to the office of District 2 City Council Member, to be sworn into office on December 11, 2018.

d. FOR CITY ATTORNEY (four-year term)

GLEN GOOGINS                                      43,333 VOTES (60.32%)

ANDREW DEDDEH                                      28,501 VOTES (39.68%)

The City Council does hereby declare and determine that Glen Googins, having received a majority of all votes cast, is elected to the office of City Attorney, to be sworn into office on December 11, 2018.

3. The total number of votes received for the measure is as follows:

The City Council does hereby declare that a majority of voters who voted on Measure Q voted in favor of it, and that the measure was carried, and shall be deemed adopted and ratified.

4. The number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to the candidates named above for the offices for which they were candidates, and for and against Measure Q, are listed in Exhibit 1, attached to this Resolution and incorporated by this reference.
5. The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City of Chula Vista a statement of the results of the election, showing: (1) The whole number of votes cast in the City; (2) The names of the persons voted for; (3) The measure voted upon; (4) For what office each person was voted for; (5) The number of votes given at each precinct to each person, and for and against the measure; (6) The total number of votes given to each person, and for and against the measure.
6. That the City Clerk shall immediately sign and deliver to each of the persons so elected a certificate of election; that the City Clerk shall also administer to each person elected the Oath of Office prescribed in California Constitution and shall have them subscribe to it and file it in the office of the City Clerk. The term for each person so elected shall then commence.
7. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.
