# BACKGROUND

Shared Micro-Mobility Devices are considered to be pedal bikes, electric-assist bikes (e-bikes), and electric-assist scooters (e-scooters) that do not require a base station for operation.

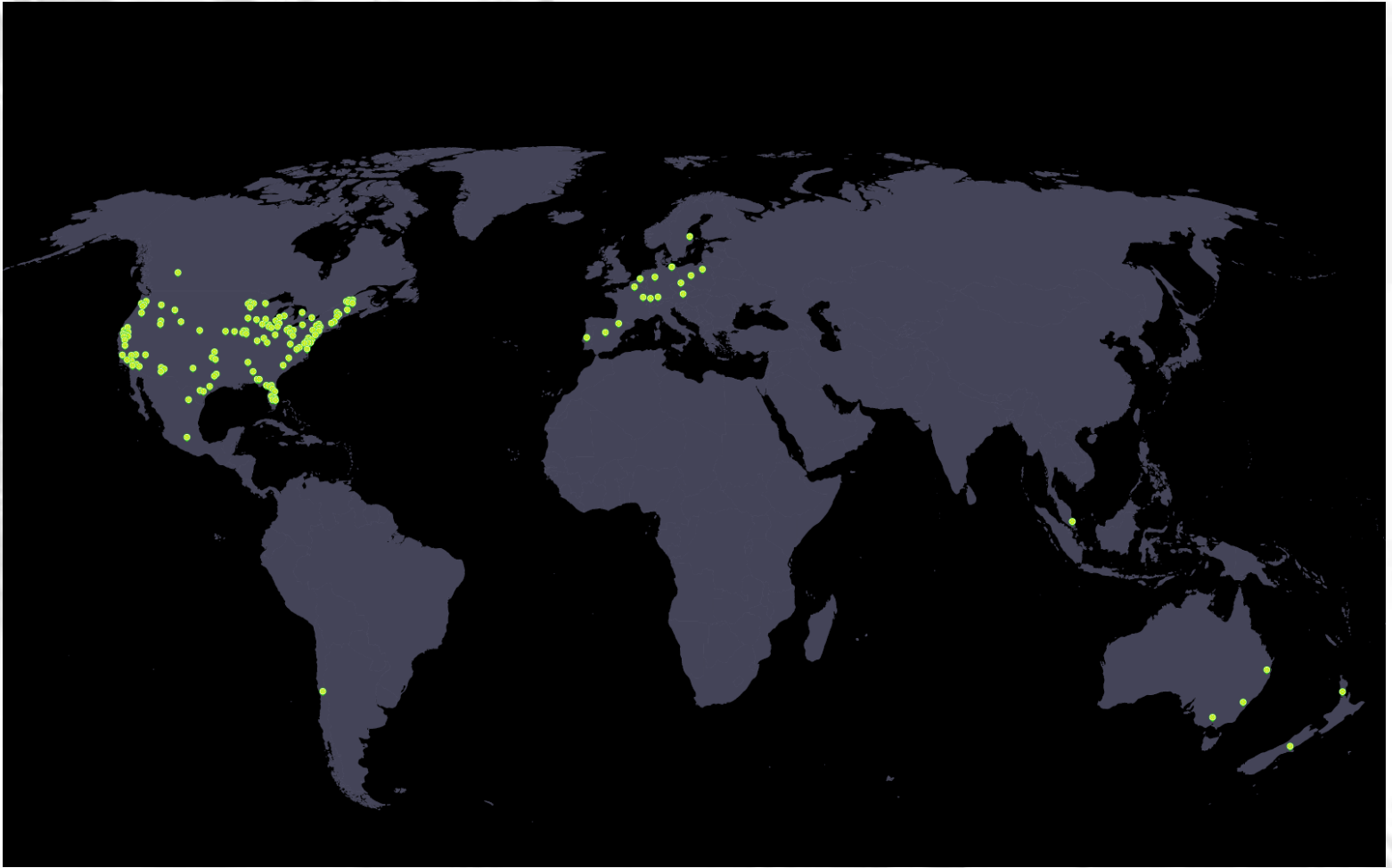

# CHULA VISTA'S SHARED MICRO-MOBILITY DEVICE PROGRAM

- Based on successfully managed programs deployed in other local agencies. (Los Angeles, Santa Monica and Seattle)
- 1-year pilot program
- Phased deployment for shared device fleet
- Close City monitoring with swift response to complaints
- Intended to be revenue neutral
- Will incorporate recent changes to CVC for e-scooters (*Assembly Bill 2989*)
