I am writing to you with great concern for the health of individuals and families in our city, based on the planned rollout of 5G wireless service, and the massive increase in electromagnetic fields (EMF) that will result. If planning commissioners are involved in the decisions of our city with regard to 5G, please also forward my email to them. Also please forward my email to decision makers in smaller towns that share a border with us.

Thousands of PhDs, MDs and other health professionals have formally registered their concerns that 5G will amplify levels of EMF already shown to cause harm exponentially, through petitions such as 5gspaceappeal.org and 5GAppeal.eu to governments throughout the world

Human beings are made up of electromagnetic fields, and over 8,000 published studies show harm to human and animal life due to exposure to chaotic radiation from unnatural, man-made frequencies.

5G is in the 28 to 300 GHz range, representing orders of magnitude higher exposure for everyone in the city where 5G has rolled out, than has ever been experienced before (with 2G, 3G, 4G).

These chaotic frequencies are highly disruptive to healthy human frequencies, and many experts warn of potential hormone disruption, cancer risk, mental health problems, dizziness, tinnitus, rashes, trouble sleeping, and anxiety disorders.

The higher-bandwidth of 5G is good for the telecom industry, but it isn't good in any way for humans, or for the cities who then may be liable for the damage to the population they represent.

Did you know that the telecom companies installing the 5G infrastructure cannot get insurance against harm to human health, of their EMF-emitting towers and devices? Please ask them!

This alone should give you grounds to deny them the right to install in our city. Insurance companies will not insure them because they know how significant the risk of harm is! If insurance companies will not insure this infrastructure, why would you allow it in our city?

Did you know that they cannot sue you, even if you've given them permission to install, for anything beyond the cost of the permit they paid? I think giving them back their permit fees would be a very good idea!

As our city rolls this out, they do so with absolutely no testing whatsoever by the telecom industry. They admitted to a Congressional committee that they have done no safety studies at all.

If you are unaware of the risks of chaotic radiation, and you have approved the rollout of 5G, it's time to stop and examine this decision, before telecom has invested millions in this town, and you LATER decide the toll on human health is unacceptable and want to roll it back. (But again, remember: they cannot sue our city for the cost of their installation / infrastructure. Only for the permit! Check this out with the city attorney, please.)

And you can't get away from 5G once it's rolled out. For instance, a colleague of mine hired some EMF experts to test her home, and when they were done, she sent them to a site locally where 10 5G towers had been installed.

Within 50 yards of the building, and all around and in the building, the electrical and magnetic fields maxed the meter. The sophisticated metering detected dangerously high EMF, and 15 unsuspecting employees work in that building, and are now subjected to massive cancer risk.

No one informed them of this risk. We called the manager of that facility, who had no awareness of any health risk of 5G towers being installed there.

The citizen action committee we are forming intend to call every school, business, and medical facility where telecom likes to install towers, and tell them that there is significant risk and danger if they do so. Unless the city is willing to stop the rollout of 5G before it comes to that.

Introducing high-powered, constantly emitting, man-made frequencies into our natural fields, is cavalier and irresponsible. Are you okay with taking such huge risks with your family's life? We aren't either.

My name is Viviana Rouston and I am a resident of Chula Vista, California. I am writing to demand the following legislative changes you can make to eradicate the decimation of Black people at the hands of police officers.

The following is a compilation of background information and implementation strategies for necessary legislative actions derived from collecting the pleas of Black organizers, activists, and journalists:

1. Redirect Police Funding

Phillip McHarris (doctoral candidate focusing on race) and Thenjiwe McHarris (strategist with the Movement for Black Lives) <u>explain the problem</u> with current police reform efforts:

"More training or diversity among police officers won't end police brutality, nor will firing and charging individual officers. Look at the Minneapolis Police Department, which is held up as a model of progressive police reform. The department offers procedural justice as well as trainings for implicit bias, mindfulness and de-escalation. It embraces community policing and officer diversity, bans 'warrior style' policing, uses body cameras, implemented an early intervention system to identify problematic officers, receives training around mental health crisis intervention, and practices 'reconciliation' efforts in communities of color."

Evidently, that was not enough. Instead of heightening the resources that officers have, they advocate redirecting funds to alternative emergency response programs, which can also be fueled by state-level and local-level grants. The McHarris' argument is that we should work towards a reality in which healthcare workers and emergency response teams should handle substance abuse, domestic violence, homelessness, or mental health cases, while rapid response social workers provide individuals with the care they need. Community organizers would be responsible for spearheading responses to the pandemic. "The average police recruit spends 58 hours learning how to shoot and only 8 hours learning how to de-escalate." Police officers are not trained nor necessary in reacting to such crises—specialized responders are.

Most police funding is budgeted and taxed at the local level, with city-level and county-level votes periodically increasing budgets. In 2017, <u>Oakland allocated the highest share of its general fund to policing</u> nationwide, at 41 percent and \$242.5 million. It is crucial to establish state-level and local-level bans on heightening police funds, while simultaneously redirecting budgets to the aforementioned alternatives.

For-profit policing is a large culprit. Even though <u>Governor Brown's 2016 bill</u> helped protect Californians from civil asset forfeitures, this is far from sufficient. As of 2020, <u>66.25% of forfeiture profits go to police</u>—a C+ rating.

The Black Lives Matter Movement <u>demands</u> "acknowledgment and accountability for the devaluation and dehumanization of Black life at the hands of the police... We call for a national defunding of police. We demand investment in our communities and the resources to ensure Black people not only survive, but thrive."

The McHarris' conclusion states, "We need to reimagine public safety in ways that shrink and eventually abolish police and prisons while prioritizing education, housing, economic security, mental health and alternatives to conflict and violence."

A persistent, genuine, and well-thought-out legislative effort to redirect police funds and end forprofit policing is imperative.

2. Abolish Legislative Police Protections

Murderers who wear a badge have consistently been given a free pass to decimate Black life. <u>BLM</u> "demand[s] accountability [for] those who are victims of police violence."

It is vital to ensure that police officers are met with precisely the same consequences as their badgeless counterparts. Accountability has been denied to Black people for centuries, and it is crucial to impose legislative confirmation that accountability is ensured.

<u>Campaign Zero</u> is an organization dedicated to "limiting police interventions, improving community interactions, and ensuring accountability."

They propose a solution of independent investigations. Because only 1% of all killings by police lead to an officer being charged with a crime, "independent investigations and prosecutions of police officers" must be mandated to eliminate biases. A broken system should not be evaluating itself.

3. Demilitarize the Police

Campaign Zero emphasizes that <u>studies</u> show how "more militarized police departments are significantly more likely to kill civilians." Unfortunately, "the federal 1033 program transfers military weapons to police departments."

<u>Campaign Zero</u> continues that to demilitarize, we must "prohibit cities and counties from using federal funds to purchase military equipment."

California is not void of this indictment. In total, 41 MRAPs are in the possession of law enforcement agencies in California. All in all, California's quantity of purchasing such outlandish and high-level military technology is unmatched: "In terms of cash value, California gets more 1033 gear than other states."

Even though the LAPD has refused to take on more military equipment, they stated that "the department will replenish and replace" existing equipment. Such measures must be barred in an effort to eventually demilitarize the police force entirely in the long run.

Police departments should be <u>restricted</u> from using federal grant money to purchase military equipment, using the SWAT team, or conducting no-knock raids. Over-weaponized departments must reduce their use of weapon stockpiles, as "agencies should seek to return to the federal government the military equipment that has already been received" as <u>places like San Jose already have</u>.

The <u>warranting</u> is simple: "Military equipment naturally increases military-style training for said equipment. That training can increase the other dimensions of militarization," contributing to the war-like mentality implicitly enforced by the police, who have no place fighting wars against the most disenfranchised members of their communities.

I hope that our legislators can take tangible, policy-level initiatives to defend Black lives, something they have failed to do so up until this point. Please listen to the pleas of the Black entities listed above and countless others, and help give rise to a future where Black folks do not have to fear for their lives on a daily basis.


