I started a small non-profit, <u>86Sanitizer.org</u> which solely procures hand sanitizer from local craft breweries who have converted to making safe, made in the USA ethanol for hand sanitizer as this keeps brewery workers employed (they'd be furloughed otherwise). 86 then gives it away - free of charge - to our local food banks, low-income seniors/veterans/families, and homeless populations - those who need it and are most at risk at catching Covid-19.

I am asking for your help. The need is great, and we are 100% volunteer. Your donation is 100% tax-deductible, and every dollar puts hand sanitizer in hands.
