

COVID-19 Percentage Positive





Percentage of Positive COVID-19 Cases Among Tests by Date Reported Total Number of Cases = 211,787





Daily New Cases in Chula Vista






COVID-19 Daily Hospital Bed Census



COVID-19 Daily Hospital Census, San Diego County Includes Cases and Suspect COVID-19 Patients



COVID-19 Daily ICU Bed Occupancy and Capacity, San Diego County Includes Cases and Suspect COVID-19 Patients






Testing

- Averaging 3,189 tests/week
 - Roughly 640 tests/day
- Conducted more than
 35,000 tests since October

Vaccination Phases

Vaccinating NOW

Healthcare workers, others in Phase 1A (all Tiers), and those aged 75 and older may visit County vaccination sites, including the Petco Park Super Station. For those 65 and older, the County intends to begin vaccinations for this population before the end of the month, pending vaccine supply.

Phase 1A-Tier 1 Vaccinating NOW

- Acute care, psychiatric, and correctional facility hospitals⁺
- Skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and similar settings for older or medically vulnerable individuals
 - Include residents in these settings as recommended for Phase 1A by ACIP
- Paramedics, EMTs, and others providing emergency medical services
- Dialysis centers
- Behavioral health residential facilities

Phase 1A-Tier 2 Vaccinating NOW

- Intermediate care, for persons who need noncontinuous nursing supervision, and supportive care
- Home healthcare and inhome supportive services
- Community health workers, including promotoras
- · Public health field staff
- Primary care clinics, including Federally
 Qualified Health Centers, Rural Health Centers, correctional facility clinics, and urgent care clinics
- Behavioral health nonresidential or outpatient facilities

Phase 1A-Tier 3 Vaccinating NOW

Other settings and healthcare personnel not identified in Phase 1A-Tier 1 or Phase 1A-Tier 2, including:

 Specialty clinics, laboratory workers, dental/oral health clinics, pharmacy staff, and funeral workers and others.

Phase 1B** Vaccinating NOW

- 1B-Tier 1:
 - · Persons aged 75 years and older

Phase 1B** Vaccinating NEXT

- 1B-Tier 1:
 - Persons aged 65 years and older
 - Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors: Education & Childcare; Emergency Services; and Food & Agriculture
- 1B-Tier 2:
 - Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors: Transportation Systems and logistics; Industrial, Commercial, Residential, and Sheltering Facilities and Services; Critical Manufacturing
 - Congregate settings with outbreak risk (includes incarcerated and persons experiencing homelessness)

Phase 1C**

- · Persons 50-64 years of age
- Persons 16-49 years of age who have an underlying health condition or disability which increases their risk of severe COVID-19
- Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors: Water and Wastewater;
 Defense; Energy; Chemical and Hazardous Materials; Communications and IT; Financial Services; Government Operations/Communitybased Essential Functions

Phase 2**

· General population over 16 years of age
