DISCUSSION

The purpose of the grant from the Chula Vista Charitable Foundation is to support environmental projects that promote the rich natural resources and open spaces throughout Chula Vista and which make the biggest impact in the lives of people who work, live and play within the boundaries of Chula Vista. The Chula Vista Library, with a parking lot lacking dedicated pedestrian areas resulting in foot traffic and automobile traffic sharing driveways, applied for the grant to rectify this and requested \$20,000. The grant proposal included both a physical change to the layout and landscaping of the parking lot and also a proposal to use the parking lot to engage the public in an open air environment. Changes to the parking lot will include replacing existing landscaping with drought tolerant plantings, providing information about water saving landscaping, and the delineation of pedestrian only areas through the use of plantings and structural elements such as pavement markers, raised markers, benches and planters. This will create a diagonal pedestrian pathway running from the Garrett Avenue/F Street corner of the lot to the east entrance of the library. The library has also proposed creating dedicated space for outside events (book sales, blood drives, etc.) that would be highly visible, able to be reserved, and likely to engage the general public.

DECISION-MAKER CONFLICT

Staff has reviewed the property holdings of the Chula Vista City Council members and has found no property holdings within 500 feet of the boundaries of the property which is the subject of this action. Consequently, this item does not present a disqualifying real property-related financial conflict of interest under California Code of Regulations Title 2, section 18705.2(a)(11), for purposes of the Political Reform Act (Cal. Gov't Code §87100, et seq.).

Staff is not independently aware, and has not been informed by any City of Chula Vista City Council member, of any other fact that may constitute a basis for a decision maker conflict of interest in this matter.

LINK TO STRATEGIC GOALS

The City's Strategic Plan has five major goals: Operational Excellence, Economic Vitality, Healthy Community, Strong and Secure Neighborhoods and a Connected Community. The Parking Lot to Parklet Project supports the Healthy Community goal by encouraging pedestrian access and improving parking lot safety and the Connected Community goal by providing a place for outside gathering.

CURRENT YEAR FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of this resolution will result in a one-time appropriation of \$20,000 to the Supplies and Services expenditure category of the Other Grants fund.

ONGOING FISCAL IMPACT

There is no ongoing fiscal impact for accepting these grant funds.
